

Inattentional blindness


THIS MARKS DECRAUZAT'S FIRST

THROUGHOUT THE EXHIBITION.




Screen, 2024 Acrylic on canvas Dims.: 80 x 80 cm. (PH034)











Screen, 2024 Acrylic on canvas Dims.: 110 x 80 cm. (PH033)






Screen, 2024 Acrylic on canvas Dims.: 130 x 80 cm. (PH035)




WHAT IS SEEN HIDES WHAT IS UNDERNEATH.



LINE.


WHAT IS SEEN IS NOT NECESSARILY




Screen, 2024 Acrylic on canvas Dims.: 80 x 80 cm. (PH040)



On one hand, the exhibition will showcase Decrauzat's latest canvases under the title SCREEN, an ambitious exploration within his body of work.

In the gallery's second space, an unpublished film by Decrauzat will be presented. Shot in black and white, the film is designed for display using a custom-made projector, which presents it in a vertical format with three frames shown simultaneously. The piece captures Decrauzat's hand in repetitive motion—opening and closing, drawing closer and pulling away.

Through this film, Decrauzat induces a reflection on the study of hand movement and how our gaze can be directed, even manipulated, unframing our attention.

In fact - and eventually linking both projects together - both the paintings in the exhibition and the film invite us, through the material characteristics of canvas or celluloid and their format (which in some paintings is vertical, like a double or triple frame, arranged one on top of the other), to reflect on the image and how, with the new systems of vision and the visual bombardment, we appreciate it today.
